Examples of how these SIOP® components promote college- and career-readiness:

Lesson Preparation:

Content standards, such as the CCSS, are used in Lesson Preparation as a source of content objectives for teacher planning of standards-aligned instruction. The WIDA ELD Standards are used in a similar way as a source of language objectives.

Interaction:

Teachers plan frequent opportunities for academic discussions and other oral language practice in SIOP® lessons.

Lesson Delivery:

Teachers analyze how the construction and delivery of classroom lessons support content standards as well as encourage full student engagement.

Review & Assessment:

Teachers review and assess content and language objectives derived from content standards and support student growth and achievement as they move towards mastery of the state standards.
